NECTFL is pleased to announce that we are accepting applications from state organizations for the NECTFL Teacher of the Year (TOY). The award is intended to elevate the status of our profession at the state, regional, and national levels by creating opportunities for recognizing the most accomplished members of our profession. First and foremost, this process is designed to involve all of our state, regional, and national organizations in promoting our profession. Second, it is intended to create as many media opportunities as possible to increase the visibility of the importance of learning languages and cultures to the general public. Successful candidates must be full-time language educators who spend at least fifty-percent (50%) of their time in direct teaching during the year of application with an expectation of teaching during the next two (2) years.

NECTFL is prepared to waive conference registration fees for all state-level nominees and to cover one night at the conference hotel **for all**NECTFL TOY finalists. NECTFL will also provide a stipend to assist the NECTFL TOY to participate in the ACTFL Convention 2017 in Nashville, TN.

We are delighted to offer states this opportunity to highlight the accomplishments of language professionals. The need for powerful exemplars of professional practice is great. We appreciate all that you do to support teacher leadership in the language profession.
